Wrap Around Care Update

We wanted to let you know in advance that governors are currently reviewing the pricing of our wrap-around and after-school clubs. Like many schools, we are experiencing rising staffing costs and increases in essential resources and sundries needed to run the clubs safely and sustainably.

To ensure we can continue offering high-quality provision, it is likely that there will be a price increase from April 2026.

At this stage, no decisions have been finalised and we will share the confirmed prices with you as soon as the review is complete. We are letting families know early to support planning and avoid any surprises.
