It has been another busy and engaging week across the school, with pupils enjoying a range of exciting learning opportunities in the hot weather!

In KS1, pupils have been exploring temperature as part of their science learning. They investigated how temperature can be measured using thermometers and compared temperatures in different environments. The children enjoyed making predictions, recording their findings and discussing how temperature affects our daily lives. Pupils showed joy as they saw the impact their work had on the school by exploring how we can help keep ourselves cool especially in the sudden heat changes, great work KS1!

Our EYFS children have made the most of the wonderful weather through outdoor learning experiences. They have been developing their curiosity and creativity while exploring the natural environment, building physical skills and engaging in imaginative play developing our fruits of the spirit of love, towards their environment and learning. Outdoor activities have provided valuable opportunities for discovery and learning across all areas of the curriculum.

Meanwhile, in KS2, pupils have been developing their digital skills by exploring coding using Excel. They learned how to use formulas, logical thinking and sequencing to solve problems and create simple coded solutions. The children demonstrated excellent resilience and teamwork as they tackled new challenges and expanded their understanding of technology. Pupils demonstrated self-control as they navigated through their new learning.

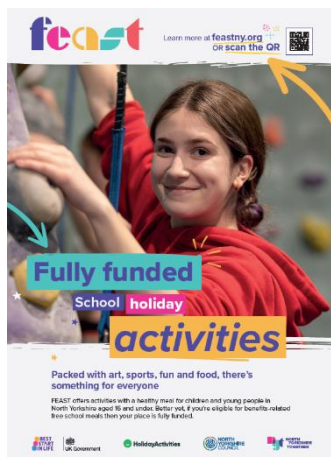
For our play, we need props- please can your child make an ancient Greek style shield and a sword at home and bring this in to school.

Fully funded summer holiday activities with FEAST



FEAST is back this summer, offering holiday activities with a healthy meal for young people aged 16 and under across North Yorkshire. Better yet, if you are eligible for benefits-related free school meals then your place is fully funded.

What's happening when?

From Monday 15th June – browse activities on the FEAST website or view the offline activity listings to see what's on in your area.

Monday, Monday 22nd June – vouchers go live. Eligible families will receive a text or email from Holiday Activities to redeem their voucher and request places.

From Friday 24th June – activity providers begin allocating places.

Funded places are available for children who receive benefits-related Free School Meals (or who are eligible by exception – see the [FEAST FAQs](#) for details). Each activity you book includes a free healthy meal for your child.

If you believe your child is eligible and do not receive your voucher on 22nd June, please contact your school office.

Families who are not eligible for funded places may be able to book paid places directly with

providers.
