Dear Parents/carers,

What another wonderful week we have had at Terrington. All of our pupils loved engaging with Audrie for our drama session on Tuesday. EYFS explored stories through puppets, KS1 worked with puppets to improvise a story and KS2 created their own stories to perform in groups. Pupils loved developing their teamwork, public speaking and listening skills as part of their learning.



This week we welcomed back Reverend Douglas who led our Collective Worship on Wednesday morning. Our focus this week was treasure and the pupils loved hearing about the different types of treasure we have including those that mean the most to us. They reflected on their belongings, loved ones and things they would like to achieve in the future.

As we look forward to the next coming weeks, we are excited to be having a demo from the Richard Shephard Foundation to develop our music within school. We would like to say thankyou to one of our parent governors who has a musical background for researching into the foundation and supporting us with this.

Updated Requirements For Participation in Physical Education

Due to the updated requirements from North Yorkshire County Council, we have had to make amendments to our PE kit expectations to ensure the safety of our children. Can we please ask that children either do not wear jewellery, watches and earrings for school or that they are able to take them off / out. School will not be responsible for the loss of any of these items removed during PE.

The North Yorkshire requirements state that the wearing of personal effects, such as jewellery and watches, is prohibited as "persons who are wearing jewellery and watches can potentially expose themselves and others to the risk of injury while taking part in Physical Education.

There have been serious incidents and legal cases involving jewellery in PE and physical activity and this procedure protects against that happening. It is not just about making the wearer of the ear-ring safe, it is about keeping everyone safe thus making a parental disclaimer ineffective and legally unenforceable.

The following advice applies to ALL body jewellery and watches, except for bracelets worn for religious reasons that cannot be removed. These bracelets will be covered with a sweatband and secured by tape. All schools should follow the advice of the Association for Physical Education (AfPE) as follows:

- The basic rule is that all jewellery should be **removed** as this then removes that particular hazard.
- The National guidance has always been that **no jewellery should be worn in PE** and that includes swimming and physical activity. It is not safe to cover ear-rings / studs / sleepers with tape. The reason is both because of the potential tearing of the ear lobe, but also the chance that the post of the ear-ring could damage the neck which is where the brachial nerve is running directly to the brain.

Pupils should remove their **own** jewellery. If the child is unable to do this themselves, they should not wear any.

School has the higher-level duty of care and cannot be put in the situation of looking after their child without exercising that duty of care. It is dictated by national guidance, and we must comply. Parental disclaimers are ineffective and legally unenforceable."

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that all students can participate safely in PE. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact the school office. Thank you for your understanding and support with this.

I am writing to invite you to our Open Evening so that you can see for yourselves what Malton School has to offer.

For Year 6 parents I know that the coming month is an important time for you in making the choice of secondary school for your child. We have arranged our Open Evening at what I hope is a helpful time for you. There will be a presentation at 6:30pm in the Main Hall (West Wing) from myself, which will be repeated at 7.30pm for anyone unable to attend the first one.

There will then be a chance to visit all the Departments of the school to see (and participate in!) a selection of their work. You and your child will be able to ask questions to a wide range of staff and current students to get a flavour of life at Malton School. Information will be available about our iPad for Learning scheme (every student has an iPad, and these are used extensively to enhance work in class and at home) and our extended day on a Thursday in which we deliver a wide range of personal skill development activities. There will be refreshments available and a sample of school dinners to try.

I am also aware that many Year 5 parents will be looking a year ahead to the decision they will have to make. You are very welcome to attend our event if it would be helpful for you at this stage.

In addition to the free transport offered by North Yorkshire Council to families in our catchment area, Malton School also provides transport serving out of catchment areas. There are currently seven different routes, these serve:

 - o Settrington
 - o Westow and Langton
- Wolds Area including Weaverthorpe and Wharram-le-Street
- South of the Malton area including:
 - o Leavening and Burythorpe
 - o Easingwold and Sheriff Hutton
- The A170 corridor including:
 - o Seamer and Pickering to the East
 - o Oswaldkirk and Kirkbymoorside to the West

Secondary School Admission Process for September 2025

Dear Parent/Carer,

This information is for children who are due to transfer to secondary school in September 2025 to let you know that the application process commences on 12 September 2024 and the deadline to apply is 31 October 2024. **You must only complete one application and this must be to the Local Authority to which you pay your council tax (i.e. Home Local Authority).**

If you live in North Yorkshire, an application indicating your preferred school for your child is required. **You can list up to five schools, applying to only one school does not increase your chances of securing a place there.** You can apply for any school or academy in North Yorkshire or any other Local Authority area.

Before completing the online application form, please ensure you have read all the information on the school admissions and transport pages. www.northyorks.gov.uk/education-and-learning/school-admissions This guide contains crucial information that will assist you in the application process.

There have been some changes in eligibility to home to school transport, so if this is an important factor when choosing a school please go to: www.northyorks.gov.uk/education-and-learning/school-admissions/finding-school. Here you can use the online tool to find your nearest school to your home address.

You can also apply online via the North Yorkshire website.

Important points to note when making an application:

The school round (2025 September - Transfer to Secondary School) is specific to your child's date of birth. If it is not showing after you've added your child's details, please verify that you've entered their date of birth correctly.

If your child is out of their chronological year group, you are not able to apply online, please contact us to request a paper copy of the form.

We recommend including a preference for your nearest school. Failure to do so may result in your child being allocated a school some distance from your home, for which you would be responsible for transport arrangements and costs.

Once you have submitted your application you will receive an acknowledgment email. You can go back into view your application at any time but once the Council has downloaded your application, you will not be able to change your preferences.

If you need to make a change after you have submitted your application, you will need to complete a 'changes to submitted school application form' which is available online or request a paper copy.

The deadline for applications to be received is 31 October 24. An application received after this date will be considered as a 'Late Application'. This means it will be processed after on time applications, which could affect the allocation of your child's school place. Should you submit a late application, and you have a valid reason for this, please provide them for consideration. Reasons for a late application must be submitted in writing via email.

Please note: the last date for making changes to applications, e.g. change of address is 30 November 2024. Any changes received after this date will not be actioned until after National Offer Day.

On National Offer Day, 3 March 2025, you will receive confirmation of your child's secondary school place.

If you applied online, an email notification will be sent, during office hours on the same day, with a secure link to access your child's school place offer. You will also be able to log back into your account to view the offered school place, please remember to save your login details.

If you submitted a paper application, allocation letters will be sent out by second-class post and could take 3-5 days to arrive. Please note that we cannot provide school place information over the phone.

Where we are unable to allocate a place at any of your preferred schools, in line with current legislation, you are entitled to an admission appeal. Appeal forms will be available on our website or by contacting the Admissions Team.

Should you need more information about individual schools, you can obtain a prospectus directly from the school.

Some denominational and Academy schools require a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) to assess your application according to the school's admission policy. Failure to submit a SIF may result in your application being considered after all others where a SIF has been provided. A SIF is not an application for a school place, and you will still need to apply via the Local Authority.

Regardless of the type of school you are applying for (Academy, Community, Aided, Trust, or Foundation), an application must be made. If you wish to apply for a school in another Local Authority area, list it on your application, and we will coordinate with that Authority.

Please retain all correspondence, including emails and acknowledgments, as you may need them if you wish to appeal the decision on the school that is allocated.

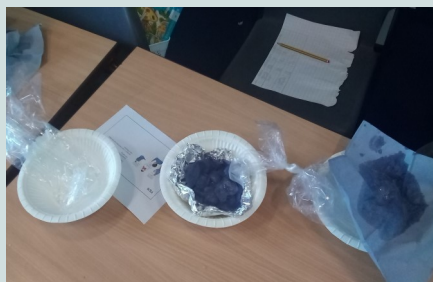
