Dear Parents and carers,

Welcome back to Autumn term 2! I hope you have all had a lovely half term break.

We have had a great start back to the term in our EYFS and KS1 class where the children began their practise of their nativity performance. They had lots of fun learning their new songs using their learnt singing skills to experiment with intonation and pitch as well as actions to accompany the singing. The pupils demonstrated their growing confidence, especially our EYFS children.

KS2 had an amazing start to the term where they began exploring their new topics. In computing, the pupils delved into the innards of a computer by exploring the purpose of inputs and outputs. They worked collaboratively to role play how data transfers from a mouse to the computer, to the screen in order to display the output. They then used their new knowledge to create a poster to share the information with an audience.

PSHE this half term

This half-term in PSHE, we will be looking at topics around consent and respectful relationships at an age appropriate level. We wanted to make parents aware due to the nature of the topics covered, specifically in KS1 and KS2.

KS1 children will be learning about respect, what it means to ask for permission and what the difference is between acceptable and unacceptable touch and who to tell if someone does make us feel uncomfortable. Pupils will be looking at the NSPCC 'what's in your pants is private' which can also be found here: <https://www.nspcc.org.uk/keeping-children-safe/support-for-parents/pants-underwear-rule/>

In year 3 and 4 we are going to be looking at how to navigate friendships, unkind behaviour and what to do in the event of bullying and other hurtful behaviour.

Year 5 and 6, they will be looking at acceptable and unacceptable touch, how this makes them and other people feel and also when and why it is important to ask for permission for physical contact.

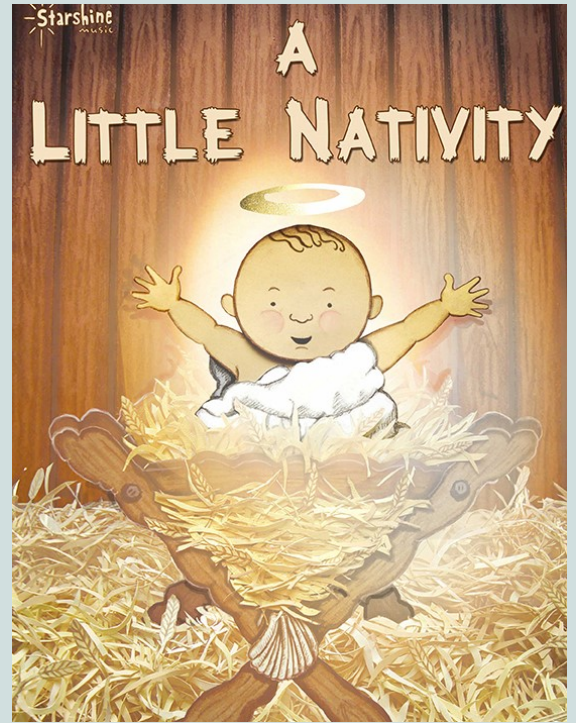


WOW WORK
