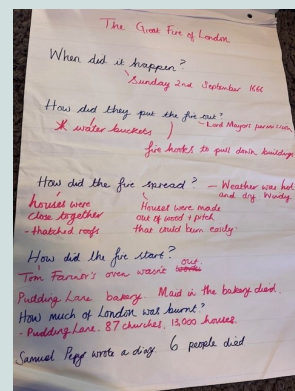
Mrs Rutherford KS1

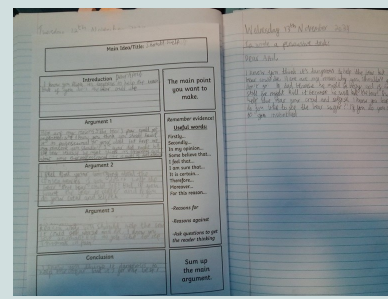
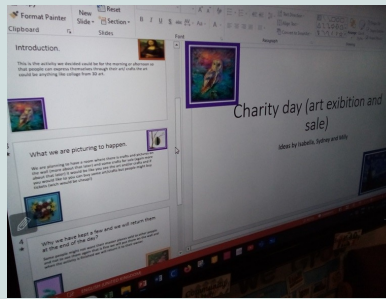
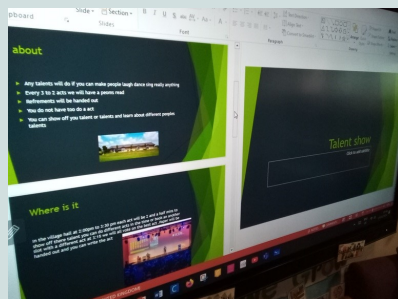


Mr Marshall KS2

Five Night's at Freddy's Information For parents

It has been brought to our attention that some children in the federation have been playing their own variation of the game 'five nights at Freddie's'.

This game is not age appropriate due to the horror theme and nature of the game.

We have attached some information regarding this game along with parental advice.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about FIVE NIGHTS AT FREDDY'S

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?
Five Nights at Freddy's is a series of indie point-and-click horror games whose main all-month success and widespread spin-off content on YouTube have helped each of the five instruments to far to east about the million copies on Steam. One of the most popular games, set in a remote location at night, with creepy animatronic characters suddenly coming to life, the games are rated PEGI 12 for occasional violent content, mild profanity and horror elements.

FRIGHTENING THEMES
Five Nights at Freddy's (FNAF) has several horror themes including the use of animatronics, a dark and creepy atmosphere, and a focus on survival. The game is rated PEGI 12 for occasional violent content, mild profanity and horror elements.

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT
As a result of their popularity, FNAF has become a common topic of discussion on social media. However, the game's content is not suitable for children under 12. The game features a dark and scary atmosphere, as well as a number of characters that are designed to be frightening. The game also contains some language that may be inappropriate for children under 12.

STRESSFUL SITUATIONS
Due to their scary atmosphere, FNAF can be a stressful experience for some children. The game's focus on survival and the threat of being killed by the animatronics can be a source of anxiety for some children. The game's dark and creepy atmosphere can also be a source of stress for some children.

PLAYING IN ISOLATION
Some parents will be relieved to hear that the game is not a multiplayer game. However, the game's popularity has led to a rise in the number of children playing the game in isolation. This can be a concern for some parents, as playing the game in isolation can lead to social isolation and other mental health issues.

IN-GAME SPENDING
The game is free to play, but it does contain in-game purchases. These purchases are for cosmetic items and are not necessary to play the game. ADVICE FOR PARENTS & CARERS

USE PARENTAL CONTROLS

TRY IT YOURSELF
Play the game yourself to see if it is suitable for your child. The game is a point-and-click horror game, so it is not as scary as it looks. However, it does contain some horror elements. If you find the game to be too scary for your child, do not let them play it.

LIMIT SPENDING
Limit the amount of money your child can spend on in-game purchases. The game's in-game purchases are for cosmetic items and are not necessary to play the game. However, the game's popularity has led to a rise in the number of children spending money on in-game purchases. This can be a concern for some parents, as it can lead to excessive spending and other financial issues.

SPOT THE SIGNS
If you've concerned that your child might be spending too much time on Five Nights at Freddy's, it's important to talk to them about it. Ask them how they are feeling and if they are enjoying the game. If you notice any signs of stress or anxiety, talk to your child's teacher or a mental health professional. It's important to indicate that their gaming interests are going on for long.

TALK ABOUT THE RISKS
Before you allow your child to play Five Nights at Freddy's, it's important to talk to them about the game's content. Explain that the game is a horror game and that it contains some scary elements. Ask them if they are comfortable playing the game and if they have any questions. It's important to have an open and honest conversation with your child about the risks of playing the game.
