I hope you all have a wonderful weekend and I look forward to seeing the amazing learning next week!

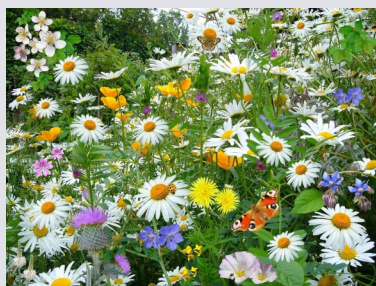

In English, we have started looking at our new book: Wonder. We have been using our inference and empathy skills to try to act like different characters (some friendly and some not so friendly) when they first meet someone who is different to them.

## **PSHE**

### **This half term in PSHE we are looking at keeping ourselves safe.**

**In year 1 and 2**, we will be looking at keeping ourselves safe. We will be focusing on following rules when crossing the roads and when on farms, who we contact if there is an emergency and how to stay safe around fire.

**In year 3 and 4**, we will be also how to keep ourselves safe. We will be focusing on understanding what risks are and how to navigate them as well as looking at different hazards that we may come across in and out of school. We will also be further developing our idea of fire safety.

**In year 5 and 6**, we will be talking in more depth about risks and what we can do to keep ourselves safe in different situations. We will also be looking at how to respond if ever faced with an emergency and allowing them to recall their first aid skills. We will finish the half term by discussing things that may make us uncomfortable and how we can find help and support if this is ever the case in order to keep ourselves safe.

## Beetle Bank Farm
